Park Passport

The Park Passport guides families to local parks and natural areas in West Michigan. It is designed to help families experience the benefits of exploring these amazing places. Families are encouraged to visit new parks, participate in challenge questions and turn their passport into the ODC for prizes.

Summer Camp Series

We offer 21 summer camps starting mid-June through August. Children 4-16 years old participate in unqiue nature-based camps for 3 days/week. We have a scholarship program for kids who may not be able to afford these experiences.

Women in Nature Program Series

This series started a way to connect more women to to great outdoors and others with similar interests. During this series, women are able to particpate in unique programs; such as kayaking, archery, gardening, ceramics, and even trips with other women in the community.

Knee-High Naturalists Program Series

Knee-high Naturalists introduces the wonders of the natural world to young children. Crafts, activities, books, snacks, live animals, and outside exploration will be incorporated into their nature-based learning experience.

Annual Events

Maple Sugar Time – March 11 & 18, 2023

Guests will join us as we tap trees, gather sap, and watch the evaporator boil the liquid down into real maple syrup at the historic Van Raalte Farm. There will be lots of activities for kids and maple snacks available for purchase.

Project Clarity Agriculture Luncheon – March 2023

Local agriculture professionals and landowners are invited to this unque event where they can meet others in their field and learn about BMP's they can implement on their land to improve the quality of our watershed.

Project Clarity Breakfast Update- April 2023
