#### History of the Finger Lakes

As the last ice age ended, receding glaciers carved the landscape of a number of states including New York. The scouring action of the glaciers melting, moving and flowing created beautiful lakes, unique gorges, and spectacular waterfalls known as the Finger Lakes. This region is composed of more than 23,000 square kilometers of beauty stretching over eleven lakes that all feed into Lake Ontario. The lake names are Canadice, Canandaigua, Cayuga, Conesus, Hemlock, Honeoye, Keuka, Otisco, Owasco, Seneca and Skaneateles. All lie within a triangle between Syracuse, Rochester and Elmira-Corning, New York.

On this Women in Nature trip, our staff will take you on adventures viewing fall color, taking day hikes, and viewing waterfalls while staying together in a beautiful vacation home.

#### Monday, October 14

Travel to lodge at Cayuga Lake

Day 1





We will begin the day at Robert H. Treman State Park for a hike to beautiful overlooks and waterfalls along Enfield Creek. The impressive view of Taughannock Falls will showcase the 215 foot drop which is the highest falls east of the Rocky Mountains. ### ACCOMMODATION INFORMATION

We will stay in a beautiful lodge on the shores of Lake Cayuga; the longest of the Finger Lakes at 40 miles long! Located along the western side of the lake, Cayuga Belle is the perfect lakeside farmhouse accommodation for a large group.

Upon entering this grand home, you will be greeted by beautiful original wood floors spanning the length of the home. Stunning wooden beams and knotty pine enhance the historical architectural qualities of Cayuga Belle. The lodge has seven bedrooms with a variety of bed sizes including 4 full bathrooms and 3 half bathrooms. Some rooms will require guests to share a king or queen size bed unless their reservation includes the single supplement fee.

In the morning, you will have the opportunity to enjoy coffee or tea on the front porch. You can also take the custom-made stone path to the lake for a walk or stop on one of the landings and overlook the lake. In the evenings, we will enjoy the 300' of lake frontage along with sunset and outdoor gathering areas with firepits.
