Michigan's Animals (ODC) Ages 4-99







Exciting News from Seedlings Discovery Preschool!



We are thrilled to announce the expansion of Seedlings Discovery Preschool! Over the winter, construction has successfully concluded on two out of the four upcoming classrooms at Seedlings Discovery Preschool.

Currently, our academic-year preschool for 4-year-olds is actively operating in one of the newly completed spaces. Now, we have a new year-round program for 2.5–3.5-year-olds operating five days a week in the second newly-constructed classroom. Our newest teachers, Taryn Neece and Amanda Wilson, have dedicated their time to familiarize themselves with the ODC's Early Childhood





Education Network's methods in preparation for the scheduled start of this exciting new program!

Simultaneously, construction has begun on the south side of the building. In just a few short months, the final two classrooms will be ready for use. Upon completion, Seedlings Discovery Preschool will feature its existing school-year preschool program, along with three additional classrooms operating in the traditional childcare format, catering to children 18 months through 5 years of age. Throughout this expansion, our focus has been to redefine and uplift the childcare experience, setting the highest standard in early child education.




English/Spanish Bilingual Children's Books

Written by Ben Gundersheimer (Mister G), Illustrated by Marcos Almada Rivero


