Title: Summer Camp Youth Leader

Reports to: Jennifer Laforest, Naturalist

Status: Part-time averaging 9-12 hours per week, unpaid with volunteer credit available

Timeline: One to eight weeks in June, July, August 2025

Overview: The Summer Camp Youth Leader is an unpaid, volunteer position. This position assists at the Outdoor Discovery Center, and at off-site locations. The volunteer's primary job responsibilities include being a positive role model while interacting with ODC Summer Campers, assisting with camp activities (including set-up and clean-up), and assisting other staff in meeting the overall goals of the organization.

Interested applicants should meet the following **Requirements:**

- Individuals aged 13 - 18 years old
- Teens who want to share their love of nature and outdoor activities with younger kids
- Youth who can commit to at least one week, 8:30am - 12:30pm, Tuesday through Thursday, between June and August 2025

Participants can earn the following **Benefits:**

- Develop work experience, leadership skills and nature knowledge
- Accumulate volunteer and community service hours
- ODC t-shirt to wear at camp

Youth Leaders will meet the following **Expectations:**

- Assist with camp activities; set-up and clean-up of materials and spaces; and other tasks as needed
- Ability to pay close attention to details, instructions, and protocols
- Ability to present ideas effectively to younger children (general comfort with public speaking)
- Strong ability to work collaboratively and follow guidance
- Attend a training session with other Youth Leaders on June 10
- Support the overall goals of the ODC Network
